### Stafford Borough Council Eco Schools Grant

Last November Sir Graham Balfour School successfully applied to Stafford Borough Council for grant funding to support a range of eco related activities.

Funding was agreed and one of the first activities was an Inter House Gardening Competition themed on the Queens 90<sup>th</sup>



Birthday. Each of the four houses was allocated a £30.00 budget to purchase plants and vegetables for their garden beds. We also had the excellent services of an excellent gardening consultant, Matt Long who helped work with the students from each house over a period of four months, to help guide them with the preparing, planting and maintaining the beds. This activity not only focused on the Queen and her long Reign of this Country and the history of our monarch but also an awareness of the garden and how plants/vegetables grow.

Another planned activity is the building of an Insect Bug Hotel in the school grounds during Activity Day. 12 students from years 7, 8 and 9 will be involved in creating a fantastic insect habitat.

# Explore Uni

Sir Graham Balfour School has been working in close partnership with the Explore Uni Programme. This is a joint venture funded by Staffordshire, Harper Adams, Keele and Stoke on Trent Universities. The aim of the programme is for students to understand and experience 'a taste' of what it is like to study at University.

On Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May, 60 of our Year 9 students visited the Staffordshire University Campus at Stoke on Trent where the students experienced what it is like to attend a University and how the learning process is lecture rather than classroom based. They were able to ask University Ambassadors questions and take part in various activities related to University life. After a tour of the campus, the day ended with a theatre performance and question and answer session.

The programme will also be funding our Year 10 students' two day
University Experience in July, one day will be based in school undertaking various workshops followed by a visit to Wolverhampton University, Walsall Campus on the second day.

### **Iceland**

Day 4 - Eyjafjallajokull Volcano


Day 5 - The Blue Lagoon

### CERN Trip

This summer 13 A level Physics students went to Cern in Geneva. At CERN, the European Organization for Nuclear Research, physicists and engineers are probing the fundamental structure of the universe. They use the world's largest and most complex scientific instruments to study the basic constituents of matter - the fundamental



particles. The particles are made to collide together at close to the speed of light. The process gives the physicists clues about how the particles interact, and provides insights into the fundamental laws of nature.

# Mission: Starlight

Students from Years 7, 8 and 9 took part in Mission: Starlight, the Royal Society of Chemistry's global experiment.


The students watched the launch video in which British astronaut and ISS resident Tim Peake, introduced the experiment which looks at the dangers of UV radiation



and how we can protect ourselves against it. The students then tested a range of substances using special colour-changing beads that react to UV light to investigate which is the best at blocking out UV rays.

Curtis Jones, was one of the many students who took part in the activity. He said, "The experiment was fun and easy to complete. We put different materials over these special UV beads and took them into the sunlight to see which material would be best for a space suit. I learned what UV energy is and that the sun produces it. I got a certificate for completing it."

Mrs O'Dell, Head of Chemistry, who organised the experiment said, "Mission: Starlight seemed like an excellent opportunity to take part in an experiment with students from across the world, and with Tim Peake's massive milestone for UK space exploration, and all the recent news and social media coverage of his time on the ISS, I thought the students would really connect with the experiment."

### Life beyond Levels ....

In the last edition I did let you know about the changes to reports from next year, but this is just a reminder:

There will be some minor changes to our Attitude to Learning and Attainment and Target Reports, particularly for Years 7 and 8. Instead of reporting students' predicted and target grades, we will be showing simply 'traffic lights' which will indicate the progress they are making according to their starting points. We are keen that students so young do not become 'hung up' on a grade which is likely to change several times in the five years up until their GCSEs - rather, we want to show the extent of their progress.
